i-Tree Website Launched

The i-Tree website (www.itreetools.org) is the new point source for all things i-Tree. For those of you wondering how i-Tree can be used in your community, www.itreetools.org is the answer.

The website provides a step-by-step process for conducting a UFORE (Urban Forest Effects Model) or STRATUM (Street Tree Resource Assessment Tool for Urban forest Managers) analysis in your community. Additionally, i-Tree Utilities are outlined to give potential users a better idea of how these tools can be utilized to facilitate data collection, provide a better understanding of the urban tree resource, and spur investment in community forests. Utilities you may be already aware of include:

- ✓ MCTI (Mobile Community Tree Inventory)
- ✓ Storm Damage Assessment protocol
- ✓ Tree Inventory PDA Utility
- ✓ Sample Inventory Generator

These workshops are aimed toward communities, industry professionals, or anyone interested in their urban forest resource.

Past workshop participants included community foresters, arborists, non-profit tree organizations, landscape architects, contractors, planners, and environmental consultants. Through classroom, computer lab and field activities, they explored topics in tree management, resource structure, benefit-cost analyses, and leveraging public support for their program.
